

Circumstances having frequently obliged me to alien my
will. I now desire that after my decease as much of my estate
be added to the estate of my son Ralph and the separate
property of his widow as will be necessary for the support
of my son Ralph's family and that William Wallace
Thomas Gunning and Joseph Stiles whom I hereby appoint
my executors be the judges how much property will be
competent to their support. The use and of my estate I desire
to be divided in four parts, one to be given to my son
Ralph's family and the three remaining parts to my three
daughters Ann Gunning, Sarah Wallace, and Catharine
Stiles. Previous however to the division of the
remainder of my estate into four parts I desire that my
servant Joe be purchased from his owners and lib-
erated for his faithful services and since he has
been many years in my employment that a generous
price be given. I further request that Joe and Char-
lotte his mother and Sylvia be supplied with main-
tenance. The plate in the possession of Mrs Mary Jane
Clay I desire to be divided among son Ralph's chil-
dren with the exception of one pair of Tumblers
which I request Mrs Mary Jane Clay to reserve to her-
self. If my daughter Mary Jane Clay should
ever marry then as it is my particular desire to pro-
vide for the children of my son Ralph I do
hereby will that the support above desired to be
secured to the family of my son Ralph be settled upon
the children of my son Ralph only.
