January twenty eighth (28th) 1828

It being the lot of all men to die, I
Joan Francis William Bourne (commonly called Francis
Bourne) of the County of Chatham being of sound
mind and memory Constitute this my last will and testament
in writing all other by me made - first I bequeath
unto my wife Sarah Copronie during her natural life
or until she should marry again the fourth part of the
net proceeds of my Estate (i.e.) of what shall be made upon the
plantation after deducting all incidental expenses.

Secondly - I will and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Fox Bourne
my son James & trusting benevolent
Sister Bourne the following Negro in the slave with the
fullest power viz. And of the same I have the
Chatham Will Bk H

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and Joseph Haberman Executors named in the above
last will and testament of Francis Haberman deceased and
qualified in and by taking the oath prescribed by law
Hear and is February 1871

Court of Chatham County being for ordinary purposes

personally appeared before the said Court of said County placed
one of the following witnesses in the solemn instrument of writ-
ing purporting to be the last will and testament of Francis Chas-
sers late of Chatham County deceased who being
duly sworn saith that he was present and did see the
said Francis Chaslers deceased sign and seal and
heard him pronounce publish and declare the said Instru-
ment of writing to be and contain an last will and tes-
tament that the said Francis Chaslers deceased was, at the
time of executing the same of sound and disposing mind
and memory to the best of this deponent's knowledge and
belief, that he the deponent and W. A. Waring and David
Sutton of the said County subscribed their names as witnesses
of the said Court and attestation at the request of
the testator in his presence and in the presence of each other

And the said John D. Mills in of the following
instrument is a paper writing purporting to be a Codicil to the
said last will and testament signed by the said Francis Chaslers
deceased sign and seal and the said Francis Chaslers deceased sign and
seal and heard him pronounce publish and declare the said
last mentioned instrument purporting to be a Codicil to
the said last will and testament that the said Francis Chaslers
deceased was at the time of executing the said Codicil of sound and dispo-
sing mind and memory to the best of this deponent's knowl-
edge and belief That he the deponent and William A
Waring and David Sutton subscribed their names as
witnesses to the said Codicil at the request of the testator in his presence and in the presence
of each other
