I Daniel M. McKenzie of the City of
Savannah County of Chatham a bid State of Georgia
Factor being weak in Body but of sound mind disposing
mind and memory do make ordain constitute
and appoint Thistle to my last will and testament in
manner and form following to wit: First I do direct
and instruct my Executors herein after named to provide my wife
Elizabeth M. McKenzie with good and sufficient mourning in
mediatly after my decease out of the proceeds of my estate
Sales order and direct that my Executors do pay out

my Estate to my Mother Elizabeth McKenzie the sum of
One Hundred and fifty Dollars per annum during her
widowhood. I give devise and bequeath to my
Beloved wife Eliza Ann McKenzie and my infant daughter
Harriet Elizabeth McKenzie all my property both real
and personal together with all and every thing good and
chattel rights and credits and ready money that I
may be possessed of to be fully and pleasantly Enjoyed by
them during the minority of my daughter Harriet Eliza
both or until she marries in that event the whole
of my Estate to be equally divided between them that
is to say, One Half of my Estate to be given to my wife Eliza
Ann McKenzie and one half to my daughter Harriet
Elizabeth McKenzie. Reserving nevertheless the Legacy
given to my Mother Elizabeth McKenzie out of my
Estate.

I thirdly do hereby request and solemnly
require my Executors herein after named that in the
Event of my wife Eliza Ann McKenzie entering into
the Marriage State with a man that they do not
approve of that they will immediately remove my
daughter Harriet Elizabeth from the care of said
man and place her under the care and guidance of some respect-
able person or persons. Lastly I do hereby nominate
and appoint my trust worthy friends Messrs. Hancock
Robert and William Henry Robert Executors to this my
last will and testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of
April in the year of our Lord One thousand and
twenty six A.D. In the fiftieth Year of American
Independence.
