Dunn the Daughter of my Brother Mrs the sum
of Fifteen hundred Dollars to her her heirs and
assigns forever Fourth I give devise and bequeath
the remainder of my property of whatsoever nature
it may consist to my Mother Brother and sister
to be divided between them share and share alike
to each of them their heirs and assigns for ever
Fifth I hereby nominate and appoint, Isaac T. Sym-
onson, Henderson and William Williams my exe-
cutors to this my last will and testament
Signed sealed published and James Dunn
declared by the testator to be his
last will and testament in presence of us who in
the presence of the testator and of each other have
hereunto set our hands as witnesses at Savannah
this 31st day of March eighteen hundred and
Twenty Two.
