ledge being of sound mind and memory make this my last
will and testament just having adopted in his early infancy
Doctor Milledge Galphin, as my foster child and having edu-
cated him unto manhood do give devise and bequeath unto the
said Milledge Galphin, all that tract or parcel of land, contain-
ing about four hundred acres more or less beginning at what is
called Mr Olenys Old field, or Negro Burial Ground run-
ning across the main Western Road across Peas branch, to
the extent of my Western and north western line, keeping paral-
lel with Mr Coleman's fence to Savannah River, except when
the line extends towards Bedford to the West of the main Road
reserving an equal share with the heirs of the said Mil-
ledge to the right of fishing; also I give devise and bequeath
to the said Milledge Galphin, all my right to one fourth part of my share
of the Lot number twelve (12) in the town ship of Augusta together with
the following negroes, all of whom have been born on my estate, to
wit Rocky, Chloe, Cenas, and their children; Amy and her children
Abulatto Jacob and his two children Elvanna and Stephen and
George the child of Elvanna, Clara with my special desire that
he treat with kindness Jacob, Clara and Elmy; all my of prop-
erty so devised and bequeathed unto the said Doctor Mil-
ledge Galphin is to be and remain incorporated to my said
Estate, untill all my just and lawful debts are paid and as-
sured; the said tract or parcel of land devised and bequeathed
as aforesaid, includes the establishment at present of Negro
Houses, an Overseers House and the buildings near them
next adjoining Mr Coleman's.
