

I Clay Willson of the City of Savannah in the County and State aforesaid, being sane in body, let of sound and disposing mind and memory, doth hereby publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that to-wit:

I give and bequeath to William Garton Lee and his heirs, the following property to-wit: One house and lot by number fifteen on Spring Hill, also the following negroes, to-wit: Judy, Peggy, Johnny, Daniel and Maria Davis, also one cow and calf, the cow bound with the letter D.

I give and bequeath to Elizabeth D. Willson and the heirs of her body my negro girl Betty, aged about fifteen years with the future issue and increase of said slave.

I give and bequeath to Clay Redden all my household and kitchen furniture and my bedding and wearing apparel.

I do hereby appoint the said William Garton Lee, Executor of this my said last will and testament. Done at Savannah this 12th day of August 1822.
