will and testament hereby revoking all former

female to her sole use and behoof, and the heirs of
her body

Fourthly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my be-
loved wife Sarah and my friend Doctor Moses
Kittell and Francis Bourgeois of the State and County
to be my Executors and Executors of
this my last will and testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Eighteenth
day of February in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand eight hundred and twenty two.
