Lord 1817 and in the Fifty seventh Year of his Majesty's reign

wheresoever the same may be at the time of my death or of
whatever nature or kind soever or whatever I may be entitled
to in any manner whatsoever either by the will of my late
husband or otherwise I give devise and bequeath the same
and every part thereof to my friends Alexander Martin
Edwards and William Martin of the Islands of New Providence
and William Will Esquire Pro-

and a strong desire to see my dear daughter and her
family settled on a comfortable and happy estate to be
in the enjoyment of one hundred and fifty pounds to be paid to her
annually as the sum of fifteen years with the interest which may
accrue thereon at 4 per cent from the day of my death and I do hereby
confer the care of the said estate to my beloved daughter Hannah
in full trust, particularly requesting that my sister will attend
to the religious and moral education of my said daughter
and that upon her arriving at a proper age that
she be brought to some fit and proper person to be taught some
useful calling, fitted to her talents and that she may be enabled to
become a decent and honest workwoman. Secondly, I hereby will
that my wife Hannah and my wife Mary and their heirs and assigns
shall have the use during her life of such part of my
estate after my death that my executor named in my aforesaid will
and be named will adopt and means as he or may be interested
with the laws of the State to secure said person to my said wife
Hannah. And further that my said executor as early as circumstances
will permit after my death shall pay out of my said estate the
sum of Five hundred pounds to my said wife Mary and that
they will allow her the use during her life of such part of my
estate as I have now in the City of Savannah as it now stands
ready to build a house in for her accommodation. Thirdly I
request my Executors named in the aforesaid will diligent-
ly and without delay to carry into effect these my last be-
quests hereby confirming my said will in all its parts with
the exceptions named above in this Codicil. In witness whereof
I have signed sealed and executed this codicil to my said
will this twelfth day of February in the Year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and Seventeen
