portion of all claims against my estate and especially, I  
my heir of all claims to debts in the said estate whosoever  
I may be obliged to have covered at any time during my  
marriage but the rest residue and remainder of my es-  
tate both real and personal I give devise and bequeath  
to my children John Macpherson, William Harden, Thomas  
William Harden, Eliza and, Finkens Harden and to such  
other child or children as may be living at the time  
of my death or may be born within the ordinary time  
of gestation after my decease to them their heirs and af-  
fines share and share alike as tenants in common  
and not as joint tenants. But it is my express will and  
desire that my wife Matilda Ann and she  
have the full and entire use and benefit of all the  
estate herein before devised and bequeathed to my  
children subject only to the charge of maintaining  
and educating my said children and during the  
term of her married hood, and the minority of my chil-  
dren, And that immediately upon the marriage of  
my said wife or so soon as my eldest child shall at-  
tain the age of twenty one years, the use and bene-  
fit herein before given to my said wife in that part  
of my estate herein before devised and bequeathed  
my children shall cease and determine and the  
property so devised and bequeathed and all  
the use and benefit of the same shall inure to and  
be vested in my said children wholly free and  
discharged from any claims of my said wife.

I appoint John Macpherson, Benim, John Mac-  
millan, John Gray and Doctor John S. Smiths Exe-  
cutors of this Will, hereby revoking all other wills  
by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto subscribed my name with affixing my seal  
this twentieth day of November one thousand eight  
hundred & fourteen.

tation to be equally divided which division not to  
take place till four years ensuing which time I de-  
clare may receive the rent for her own use, and like-  
wise give her ten shares of my Baile Black, the  
other thirty four shares I give and bequeath to my  
beloved nephew John W. Allen to him and his  
heirs.

I give to my beloved friend Mary Gurner fifty  
dollars with a ring for a keepsake and my life  
of north acceptances. I give to my nephew my  
diamond brooch requesting he will be kind  
to her, and always remember she was his nurse  
and hope she will discharge her duty to both as the  
obligation of sister requires. I give to two bush  
of my clothes & to Presilla two suits of my common clothes  
with the thin black cloth and a fine dollars, he remain  
as I give to my niece Elizabeth Mercer. I am sorry my  
property has been so much injured as to have no-  
thing worth the acceptance of my beloved niece Eliza-  
beth and of but my kissing and best wishes for  
their health and happiness. It is my earnest wish that my  
nephew be placed in Canada Dr H. Store.

My second wish is that I. Morrisson be in this with  
the Turner & McCash Smiths not inclined to be govern-  
ed by his sister. I recollect Mr. Morrison has a high  
account against the State of James Black it was  
not put in the Court of Chancery what then he remon-  
of that I give to him and his family. My last will I  
declare as to everything else, nothing all other will-
