

I Henry William Jordan being in my sound mind, do hereby make this my last will and testament, viz. I give all my property real and personal (after the payment of my lawful debts) to my four brothers and sisters, to be equally divided, share and share alike and I appoint Benjamin and Samuel O Richardson to take charge of my property and one of my Brothers do administer upon my estate and I will that my negro woman named Mary have her time in her life, and I appoint Willis A Franklin her guardian.

Signed at Muir Hall in the County of Chatham this twenty-first day of January 1826 Henry W. Jordan

Jordan late of said County planter deceased who being duly sworn said that he was present and did see the said Henry W. Jordan deceased sign and heard him promulgate and declare the within instrument of writing to be and contain his last will and testament that the said Henry W. Jordan deceased was at the time of executing the same of sound and disposing mind and memory to the best of this deponent's knowledge & belief that he the deponent and Andrew Brown of Savannah subscribed their names as witnesses to the execution of the said last will and testament at the request of the testator in his presence and in the presence of each other

In the name of God Amen. This is the last will and Testament of me Thomas Gibbons at present of the City of New York in the State of New York but late of Elizabeth Town in the State of New Jersey and formerly of Savannah in the State of Georgia Esquire Being now weak in body but of sound mind, preparing to meet the King of Jovins when he shall appear me in the feeble moments of departing life in the last severe and trying period that laboring hour of nature I do make this my last will and Testament. First I recommend my soul to the Mercy of my God through the intercession of my blessed Redeemer. Second I submit my body to the Earth to be sealed up in expectation of a happy resurrection. As to the disposition of my Estates which is the sole Object of this Instrument it is as follows. To my son Thomas Heyward Gibbons I confirm a memorandum in writing to him of the Mount Vernon Estate and the negroes therein mentioned so far as the same does not interfere with the provisions herein after contained in regard to a portion of the property and Estate in the said memorandum mentioned which had since become vested in me, but I confirm the same to him on no other Condition than is expressed in the said memorandum. And as it is provided in that memorandum that in case of the failure of issue of my said son that I shall by my last will and testament give that said Estate real and personal as I shall appoint. I do therefore by virtue thereof appoint will and declare that the said Estate real and personal shall in that event pass over to my son William Gibbons of Savannah and to his heirs and assigns upon the same terms and Conditions upon which my Estate hereinafter
