of the Lot number twelve (12) in the town ship of Augusta together with
the following negroes, all of whom have been born on my estate, to
wit Rocky Chlo^e Clenar, and their children; Amy and her children
Abulatto Jacob and her two children Thewanna and Stephen and
George the child of Thewanna, Clara with my special desire that
he treat with kindness Jacob Clara and Amy; all my of prop-
erty so devised and bequeathed unto the said Doctor Mil-
ledge Galphin is to be and remain incorporated to my said
Estate, untill all my just and lawfull debts are paid and an-
swered; the said tract or parcel of land devised and bequeathed
