my Gold watch chain seals and a trinket together with all
the estate which I may die possessed of whether real per-
sonal or mixed of what nature or kind soever

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint George W. Cun-
ningham and my brother James Smith both of the City of
Savannah of our said executors to this my last will and testa-
ment hereby revoking all former wills and testaments and every
