manner of means and wherever the same be situated whether
in the State of Georgia or elsewhere. First Give leguall and
good to my wife Michaela Holcott all the personal and
real property of which I am possessed or to which I have
any right title or claim or in which I may be at all inter-
ested whether situated in the State of Georgia or elsewhere
and all the property both real and personal which I may
hereafter possess or to which I may hereafter be entitled or interest-
ed by any manner of means, whether situated in this State
or elsewhere, to her and to her heirs and assigns forever without
limitation or condition. And I do hereby nominate and ap-
point the said Michaela Holcott the sole executrix to this
my last will and testament. Signed and sealed this
eighth day of March in the year of Our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty-one, in the City and State
aforesaid
