Lillibridge the whole of my Estate both real and personal
of what kind and nature soever wheresoever it may be
found during her natural life or so long as she shall remain
in a Widow and after her natural dying or demise, I
then will devise and bequeath all and singular the whole of that
Estate bequeathed to my beloved Wife to my only son Oliver
Martin Lillibridge to him and his heirs forever excepting
my two Slaves James and Russell which said two Slaves
I will and bequeath to my two grand Children John and
Matilda Lillibridge to be under the care and management of the
said Oliver Martin Lillibridge until the said John and Matilda
Lillibridge shall arrive to the years of Majority reserving to
my beloved Wife Sarah Lillibridge the benefit of all things
by my Will or otherwise all and singular apparel Gold Silver
Jewels to whosoever she may think proper I bequeath
to my grand son John Oliver Lillibridge my gold Watch and
Jewels and to grand Daughter Matilda Christine Lillibridge
I bequeath my Muscat Pearl and lastly it is my wish and
desire that my body should be decently buried by the Side of my
former Wife Abigail having a space on one side for my beloved
Wife Sarah and I do hereby nominate and appoint my
son Oliver Martin Lillibridge whole and sole Executor of
this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all
former Wills by me made. In Witness Whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of November
in the Year of our Lord One Thousand and eight hundred
and twenty.

proceed to make his last Will and testament, and did see him
sign and seal and heard him declare the said testament
of writing to be and contain his last will and testament.
That the said John Williamson deceased, was at the
time of executing the same, of sound and disposing mind
and memory to the best of the deponent's knowledge and
belief that in the presence of John Williamson and
William Leachman Esqrs. Subscribed their names as witnesses
to the due execution of the said will, at the request of
the testator in his presence and in the presence of each
other.

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
