I the said and do hereby declare that within a reasonable
period after my decease all my Estate both real and personal
of whatever nature or kind shall be sold at public auc-
tion, by my Executors herein after named, with that the
whole proceeds of such sale after deducting my debts and
such charges as may be entailed in carrying into effect
the provisions of my will & be paid over to the Trustees
of the Female Asylum of the City of Savannah for the
use and benefit of that institution forever.

I request that a Vault be made for the reception
of my remains in the Burial Ground in the City
of Savannah and that the remains of my Father
and Wife be disinterred and deposited with mine in
the said Vault. To do to be made.

And whereas I have during my life belonging
to my Father's Estate, and have an interest in that Estate
I give devise and bequeath all my interest in the said
money and Estate unto the said Trustees of the female
Asylum of the City of Savannah for the benefit of that
institution forever.

I do hereby nominate and appoint James
Oppinger Esquire and Adam Cope Esquire the Executors
of this my last Will and Testament.

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal at Savannah this thirtieth day of October
One thousand eight hundred and twenty two.
