funeral expenses and all my lawful debts paid by my
executors hereafter mentioned. 3^d That all monies and other
effects be collected together with any other assets belonging to me
at my death and be distributed by my executors hereafter
mentioned in the following manner. First to my Granddaughter
Annus Deborah Leiby. \$100 and bequeath the sum of \$50
fellow lawful money of the United States. 2^d To my son-in-law
Betty for his faithful services to me \$100 and bequeath
the sum of twenty dollars. The residue to be divided into
two equal shares between the Children of Christian D and
Mary Leiby and of Chas & Catherine Flinn. The part
pertained to the latter in trust to my Executors herein mentioned
and 3^d Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint Robert H
Poliquet Esq and Christian D Leiby Executors of this my
last Will and Testament.

affixed my hand and seal. Done at Danvers New England
this twenty fourth day of March in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred and twenty three and the forty seventh
of American Independence.
