In the name of God amen I Henry Bulloch of the City of Savannah in the State of Georgia man of Archibald Bulloch heretofore of Savannah (and deceased being of sound mind and understanding) and knowing the uncertainty of human life do make this my last will and testament as follows - I do hereby give and bequeath unto my sons Archibald S. Bulloch and William G. Bulloch and their heirs and assigns forever all my Estate real and Personal of whatever nature kind and description and howsoever called to be equally divided between my said two sons share and share alike. It is my will and I hereby desire that as soon after my death as conveniently may be all my estate real and personal of whatever nature or kind and howsoever devised and above bequeathed to be share and share alike to my said two sons - shall be valued and appraised in the usual manner & my executor herein after named shall cause the same to be done and it is my will and I do hereby desire and bequeath that my said two sons Arch S. Bulloch and William G. Bulloch shall pay in money in equal proportions to the widow and children of my deceased son James Bulloch one fourth part of the amount of the valuation & appraisement of my Estate real and personal herein before set out to be appraised and I do hereby further [www.georgiapioneers.com](http://www.georgiapioneers.com) that my said two sons Arch S. Bulloch and William G. Bulloch shall pay from time to time in equal proportions to my grandson William G. Maxwell the son of my deceased daughter Clara Maxwell such an over or sum of money as in their discretion he may require for his support and no more until he shall have received equal to one fourth part of the amount of the valuation and appraisement of my Estate real and personal - and in making this arrangement for my said Grandson William G. Maxwell I have his own goods in view. but should my said Grandson William G. Maxwell depart this life before he shall have received the above amount it is my will and I direct the balance shall be divided in three equal parts one third to my son Archibald S. Bulloch one third part to my son William G. Bulloch, and one third part to my deceased sons widow and children James Bulloch to be equally divided between them share and share alike and to their heirs forever and it is my will that all my debts of every kind shall be paid out of the whole of my Estate so as every fourth part first divided and every share be first lost - indeed as I think my debts will be but small the negroes will soon pay them by their work And I do make and appoint my son Arch S. Bulloch
