the salvation of all who believe on him and trust in his righteous-
ness alone for their justification; my frail body I commit to the
grave to be buried at the discretion of my friends. My property
I bequeath in the following manner.

1st I give and bequeath to my son John B. McIntosh and my
daughter Maria Jane McIntosh all my lands and negro
property to be equally divided between them.

2^d I give to my daughter Maria Jane McIntosh all my divi-
dend of certain sum of money due by Raymonds P. Somers and
his heirs in consideration of a tract of Land sold them known
by the name of Cherry Hill and also I give to my said daughter
Maria Jane McIntosh, all my dividend of certain sum of money
due by Thos. Blay in consideration of a tract of Land sold them known
by the name of Dublin with the exception of such legacies as shall
hereafter be mentioned.

3^d I give to my daughter in Law, Sister McIntosh the sum of
one hundred Dollars.

4th My Horse and Chariot I give to my said dear Daughter
Maria Jane McIntosh.

of my Kingman Mrs. J. Maxwell. I trust that the

Bonner and his sisters in consideration of a tract of Land sold them known by the name of Cherry Hill and also I give to my said daughter Maria Jane McIntosh all my dividend of Caskinsum of money due by Thos. Gray in consideration of a tract of Land sold them known by the name of Dabney with the exception of such legacies as shall hereafter be mentioned.

3^d I give to my daughter in Law, Hester McIntosh the sum of One Hundred Dollars.

4th My Horse and Chaw I give to my said dear Daughter Maria Jane McIntosh.

My Daughter I leave to the particular care and Guardianship of my Nephew Mr. J. Major who I have no doubt will be the means of an all wise and merciful Creator will so direct and train her up as one of his.
