I, Nathaniel Hall of the Island of New Providence Esquire being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding but considering the uncertainty of this transitory life as public and declare this my last will and testament hereby revoking and declaring ^{and} all & every ~~here~~ will and wills by me heretofore made. I commend my soul to God who gave it me in the humble hope of a happy resurrection through the merits & mediation of our blessed Lord Jesus Christ. It is my request if I die in the Island of Providence that my remains may be decently interred in some convenient part of my lot and as to the worldly estate which I may die possessed either in The Bahamas, or in the hands of Messrs Langton & Co of London & Thomas and John Lloyd of Liverpool and the residue after payment of the legacies herein after mentioned ~~if~~ my beloved wife Ann Hall Esq; all my house held ~~here~~, plate carriages ~~etc~~ To my sister Sarah Howell, to each of my brothers who may be living at the time of my death to my nephews George Webb Hall and Samuel Hall Esq; of Bristol and to my friends Josiah Battaille senior Esq; Thomas

William Jeffair, M^r Morton Dwyer & John Armstrong Esqrs
I bequeath the sum of five guineas each for a ring. To Ma-
theson Hall MacBister son of Matthew MacBister Esquire I give
I bequeath a negro boy named Polydore and to his sister
Hannah MacBister, a negro boy named Archie. To them &
their heirs for ever. To the following named domestics -
Cristol, Will, Peter, Morris, Young Lucy - and Rhina I be-
queath a decent suit of mourning and five dollars each
as a small token of my regard - for them as good and
orderly servants and in full confidence that they will
continue so to their mistress. To the church Wardens
Vestry of the Parish of Christ church & St. Matthews.
I bequeath in trust ten guineas to each Parish to be
distributed at their discretion amongst such indigent
persons as may stand most in need thereof, at the time
of my death. After payment of my debts (which I trust
will be very trifling), and the aforesaid Legacies I give
Devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Hall
the rest residue and remainder of all my Estates and
property Real & personal of what nature or quality, & has
soever the same may be or wheresoever situate by me
or being, in the Bahama Islands, America or else-
where, to have Chatham County N.Y. 1817-1827 & to enjoy the same
& every part and parcel thereof, to and for her use
benefit and behoof, for and during the time of her
natural life, with power and liberty to remove the per-
sonal property at her pleasure. Item. after the death of
my aforesaid beloved wife I give devise and bequeath
all and singular my aforesaid Estates and property of
every kind and description whatsoever to my executors
herein after named and to the survivor and last sur-
vivors of them and to the heirs, executors and adminis-
trators and assigns of such survivor to and for the
use, and upon the trusts herein after mentioned & de-
clared of and concerning the same. That is to say
in trust that they do apply and pay one moiety or
part thereof according to the value in such manner
& to such purposed as my aforesaid beloved wife by her
last will and testament or by any other deed or instru-
ment in writing under her hand & seal a & make in
presence of two or more credible witnesses shall direct or
appoint: and as is the other moiety or part in trust than
the same be sold or disposed of to the best advantage
and the money arising from the sale thereof be applied
just & disposed of in manner and form following, that is
to say equally divided amongst such of my nephews & neices

& share alike. The legacies to be paid out of the monies in
the hands of my agents in England. And I request that
the construction which may at any time be put on this will
may be plain & evident and natural and that no refinement
may be made use of to destroy my intention. And of this my

I give and bequeath to my Executors named in the said will one quarter cask of Madeira wine each and I appoint Henry M^r Dyer Esq in the said will named, together with Robert Thomson of New Providence Esq^r to act with them as executors to my said will. I give to the said Henry M^r Dyer & Robert Thomson one hundred and fifty dollars wine each and to the said Robert Thomson five Guineas to purchase a mourning ring having given the like sum to my other Executors for that purpose. And I direct this codicil to be held and taken as and for part of
