Sheweth the Honorable John Shepley Justice of the Inferior Court of said County having ordinary jurisdiction

Personally appeared Thos. H. Jones of said County, who being duly sworn saith that on the eighteenth day of February last past at the request & solicitation of Thomas Telfair Esquire deceased he by the directions of Thomas Telfair Esquire deceased he by the deponent drew up the annexed and foregoing instrument of writing consisting of five pages as the last will and testament of the said Thomas Telfair then at the desire of the said Thomas Telfair he read to him the said instrument clause by clause in the presence of the said Telfair every clause of which was approved as exactly drawn and expressive of his last will & intention, but he mentions his wish to alter the last clause which was accordingly done, but while this deponent was annexing the usual attestation the testator was suddenly seized with a spasmodic affection, which terminated so unexpectedly and suddenly his life as to prevent the regular execution of this said instrument as intended by him, and to the best of this deponent's knowledge and belief the said Thomas Telfair was of sound & disposing mind and understanding at the time he delivered his directions, and when this said instrument was read to him and sanctioned as above declared
