First, I order my just debts to be paid, with as little sacrifice as possible, which I recommend strictly to my executor, for the sake of my children.

Second I give and bequeath to my three daughters Clotie, Julie, and Lepty, now living with my wife their mother at Lyons in the said Department of La Seine all the property as well real as personal which may be found belonging to me at the time of my death, as well in these United States as in France, to be equally divided among them in equal portions.

In witness whereof I have signed and affixed my name and appoint M^r F. D. Petit notary of this City of Savannah Factor, to be the executor of this my last will and testament.

In Faith whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, in the said City of Savannah this Nineteenth day of July in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty four. Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence of us to whom M^r Paulin declared to be his last will and testament and who requested us to sign the same as witnesses.
