after the payment of my last debts and funeral charges I dispose of my estate as follows I give and devise all my messuages lands and tenements wheresoever situate unto my beloved wife Mary Robbins and my three children Henry Mary & Eunice Robbins to be equally divided between them share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns forever I give and devise and bequeath all my personal estate of whatever kind or nature whether in action or possession unto my said wife Mary and my said children Henry Mary and Eunice Robbins share and share alike In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred

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and thirty three at Savannah in the State of Georgia
