I bequeath to the son of my son in Law John Thomas
O'Dell the other third part, the same son of Eliza Remond
I bequeath to Mrs. O'Dell, the wife of Charles O'Dell, the son
the sum of three hundred pounds of Dollars to be paid to her
if she survives, there not yet married before my death, and such
my son or she should marry, the one who is eldest of the two, then
shall give her two hundred pounds of Dollars and the other one
hundred pounds of Dollars.

I leave as my testamentary Executor Pierre Paul Thomas
my son in Law and John Thomas O'Dell the son of my son in
Law, to execute my last will. I Request my Executors to pay me
immediately after my death, all my debts if any there should be, to wait
without compounding my creditors if any there should be, to wait
one year and a day for their dues.
