In the name of God Amen, I William Keyton, of Savannah, in said State, being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner & form following, First I give and bequeath to my wife Lydia a bed, bedstead and bedding, and my love and affection. Item I give and bequeath to William Cluff, eldest son of John and Catherine Cluff, of New York my watch and chain. Item I give and bequeath to Mary Ann Cluff, the eldest daughter of said John & Catherine Cluff, my gold enamelled diamond ring, and request that the said watch and chain and said ring be sent on immediately to the said William and Mary Ann. Item I wish and request that all the rest & residue of my goods, chattels and estate be sold by my executors to the best advantage, and I give and bequeath half the money arising from such sale, to my wife Lydia, and one fourth of the said money to my lawful daughter Emily Dougherty, and one fourth thereof to the children of John & Catherine Cluff, afterwards. And I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Lydia executrix and John Dillen, Thomas Dublin and John Shaw executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

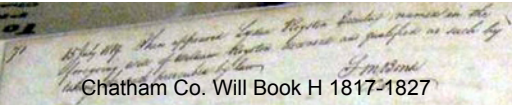
