Wills and Testaments whatever that I may have made - 341
Item 1st

In this Item I shall enumerate all the property of every kind whatever that I now stand possessed: I have in the "Grand Livre de la Cote Publique" of France, as per Certificate N^o 292 sera D. dated le Luge Sept^r 1819. An investment of funds which gives me an annual interest of Two thousand francs.

I have now in the hands of William Bardell of Paris, the sum of fifteen thousand nine hundred Francs, say 15,900 francs. I have had remitted to Messrs Hottinguer & Co of Paris by my friend Mr William Gaston, during the past four months, eight several Bills of Exchange of several Merchants of Savannah amounting in all together to the sum of 116,820 francs I continue say one hundred and sixteen thousand five hundred and twenty four francs and one centime which Bills of Exchange when paid will leave the last named amount to my Credit in the hands of Messrs Hottinguer & Co of Paris: I carry with me about five hundred Dollars in Gold to bear my expenses.

Item 2nd

I do hereby appoint my friend Mr William Gaston of Savannah to be my sole Executor of this my last will & Testament, He to act as such in the event of my decease and to come immediately after into to possession of all my worldly effects and possessions of whatsoever kind of property it may be, that I may die possessed of, either in the United States of America, France or Elsewhere.

Item 3rd

I desire that immediately after my decease all my Just and lawful debts (if any I should owe) should be immediately paid by my Executor.

Item 4th

I now do give and bequeath unto my sister Ann Angela Sedille, At present a resident of Versailles in France having no Children by her present husband, the sum of Ten thousand Dollars, to be taken by my Executor as aforesaid, out of my Effects and by him to be invested in the Public funds of France in the name and for the benefit and use of my sister as aforesaid Ann Angela Sedille, provided she should be living at the period of my decease.

Item 5th

I do hereby give and bequeath unto my friend Mr William Gaston Merchant of Savannah, The Executor of this will, all Balance of property of whatever kind it may be, I may die possessed of, after paying off all my Just and lawful debts and the sum of Ten thousand Dollars as given to my sister in Item
