

Georgia.

In the name of God amen. I, Thomas Telfair
of the city of Savannah, in the state of Georgia being
weak of body but by the mercy of God of sound and
disposing mind, memory & understanding, do publish
and declare my last will and testament as follows

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved
and affectionate wife Margaret, her heirs and assigns in
view of dower in my estate, the following property that
is to say, all my Lot and improvements near St James
Square in the city of Savannah which Lot was devised to
me by my late uncle William Gibbons, also the Lot in
Washington Wilkes County on which the old court House
stood and lately purchased by me. also the tract of Land
at which I resided, in Wilkes County & the tract which I
planted in said County, containing together about six
hundred & eighty eight acres. also all the negro slaves
that I own in said County of Wilkes and the future
issue and increase of said slaves together with George &
his wife Henry and her children and Dying & chance at
my plantation called the Ponds. also my house servants
Edmund Pally & children Chatham County Wills 1817-1827 Wally and the
future issue and www.georgiapioneers.com and female slaves -
expressing it as my wish that Wally & slaves should be
sold within six months after my death to such owners
as will be satisfactory to themselves. I also give to
my said wife all my house hold furniture in Savan-
nah and Wilkes County and my carriage & horses for her
wishing her to sell such as she may consider superfluous.

Item. I give devise and bequeath the following pro-
perty to my daughter Mary her heirs and assigns, to-
with my plantation in Columbia County in this state
devised me by my brother Josiah together with all the
negro slaves on said plantation and the future issue &
increase of the female slaves also all my personal prop-
erty of whatever kind on said plantation. I also
give to my said daughter Mary my silver mug mar-
ked Sarah Telfair, my two waiters also silver, and one
half dozen spoons, engraved with my name also silver.

Item. I give devise and bequeath to my daughter
Margaret her heirs and assigns my plantation in Cope-
County called the Ponds and all my negro slaves
on said plantation (except such as I have herein before
bequeathed to my wife) and the future issue and increase
of the female slaves together with all my personal estate

23. on said plantation, declaring it to be my will that the said plantation should be sold as soon as my executors herein after made can make it convenient, and the money arising from the said sale to be vested for her benefit in such property as my executors shall think best. I also give to my said daughter Margaret one dozen and a half of silver spoons derived from my brother's Estate.

And as my beloved wife is now enceint, if she should be delivered of a male child it is then my will and I devise to said male child my plantation in columbus County herein before devised to my daughter Mary and all my negro slaves except those bequeathed to my wife, and the residue of my property both real & personal not specially devised I devise and bequeath to my two daughters Mary and Margaret share and share alike and their heirs and assigns. But if my wife should be delivered of a daughter then my will is that all my children shall inherit the portion of each deceased Chatham County Wills 1817-1827
www.georgiapioneers.com and if all my children die before marriage or attaining the age of twenty one years I then devise & bequeath all my property both real & personal to my brother and sisters their heirs and assigns.

Item. in case of the death of any of my children before marriage or attaining the age of twenty one years, It is my will that the survivor, their heirs and assigns shall inherit the portion of each deceased child share and share alike and if all my children die before marriage or attaining the age of twenty one years I then devise & bequeath all my property both real & personal to my brother and sisters their heirs and assigns.

Item. I give my new Sideboard to my sister Sarah Haig.

Item. I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother Alexander Telfair the sole executor of this my last will & testament, conferring on him full power to sell at public or private sale any part of my estate real or personal devised to my children whenever he shall consider it beneficial to the interest of my children and to give full & complete title for the same without pursuing the formalities usually required of executors -

Item. It is my wish that the proceeds of my present crop after the payment of my debts be applied to the support & maintenance of my wife & family.

Signed Sealed published and declared by the Testator as his last will and Testament, in presence of us, who at his request and in his presence & in the presence of each other witnessed thereto, the words "her heirs and assigns" - "devised to my children being first underlined.

Harrison and Thomas W. Bond Justices of the Inferior
Court of said County having ordinary jurisdiction
Personally appeared Noble W. Jones of Savannah
attorney at law, who being duly sworn saith that on the
eighteenth day of February last past at the request to
by the directions of Thomas Telfair Esquire deceased he
the deponent drew up the annexed and foregoing in-
strument of writing consisting of five pages as the last
will and testament of the said Thomas Telfair. That
at the desire of the said Thomas Telfair he read to
him the said instrument clause by clause in the
presence of Mrs Sarah Telfair, every clause of which
was approved as correctly drawn, and expressive of his last
will & intentions, but he mentioned his wish to alter the
last clause which was accordingly done, but while this
deponent was annexing the usual attestation the testator
was suddenly seized with a spasmodic affection, which
terminated so unexpectedly and suddenly his life as
to prevent the regular execution of this said instrument
as intended by him, and to the best of this deponents
knowledge and belief the said Thomas Telfair was
of sound & disposing mind & understanding at the
time he delivered his directions, and when this said
instrument was read to him and sanctioned as above
declared.
