 Percival of the State of Georgia and County of Chatham
 who being of sound mind and memory at the time he
 constituted and declare this to be my last will and tes-
 tament in manner and form following viz. Item first
 direct my executors herein after to be appointed to pay
 my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my death
 as may be convenient. Item second: I do hereby appoint
 friend Timothy Barnard of said State and County, and my
 brother James Percival of Massachusetts, my executors
 this my last Will and Testament. Item third: I give
 bequeath all my Estate both real and personal to my
 sons and sisters, their heirs and assigns to be equally divided
 between them by my Father James Percival of Massachu-
 setts as soon after receiving it as may be convenient.
 Item fourth: on the arrival of my brother James Percival
 do hereby authorize the sale of any or such parts of my prop-
 erty as my said Executors may think proper.
