I Rachael Polock being at this time in sound mind & memory but weak and feeble in body & considering the uncertainty of this life do make this my last will & testament that is to say. First I recommend my soul to God. Second should it please the Almighty to take me from this world as my debts are few or none, after my funeral expences are paid, I give and bequeath unto my brother David Polock and his heirs for ever all the property both real & personal of whatsoever nature which I now possess or may hereafter be entitled to and lastly I do constitute and appoint him the said David Polock my only executor of this my will. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my name this twenty third day of August in the year 1817.
