

In the Name of God Almighty I David T. Bonyon being called a Judge do hereby make
in witness, do hereby declare that my last Will and Testament

First I do not all my just and lawful debts and expenses of my last illness and funeral
and if after the payment of the same there should any property remain

Second I do not all of the before said and payable to the division into six separate
and distinct parts and parcels the said division to be made by three dis-
interested and independent persons chosen by my aforementioned Executors. That when
the said division is made one part or parcel to be taken by each of my children
Wm. Bonyon, Margaret, Eliza, Charlotte, Robert and then last part or parcel
to the children of Stephen T. Williams by my daughter Ann T. Bonyon to the
Margaret Bonyon and Stephen D. Williams the said property to be
divided into six equal parts and each of them to be taken as my Executors shall direct

Third That the said division is not to be made before all my debts are settled
and liquidated

Fourth With and bequeath unto my dear Wife Margaret an annuity of one
hundred dollars for and during her natural life, to be paid out of my
said estate and I do not my estate to be charged therewith

Fifth I do hereby constitute and appoint my one Edward Bonyon and Ste-
phen T. Williams my Executors to carry into effect this my last Will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 13 June 1770
