 be equally divided between them, then as to the residue of
 my personal Estate, and as to all my real estate whatsoever
 or wheresoever of which I shall or may be in any manner
 possessed or in which in any way interested at the time
 of my death I give devise and bequeath unto my Father
 Sheldon C. Dunning and my Uncle Abraham Richards
 and to the survivor of them and the heirs Executors and
 Administrators of such survivor upon the special Trust
 nevertheless that they my said Trustees do as soon as con-
 veniently may be after my decease sell and dispose of the
 same in such manner on such terms and in such pro-
 portions as they shall think most advantageous to my
 Estate and the proceeds or monies arising therefrom to
 appropriate in the manner following that is
