present residing at Beaufort hill plantation in the State of South
Carolina in the United States of North America. I George
Brown being of sound mind and memory but considering the
uncertainty of this mortal life do make and publish this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to
say) First I resign my soul into the hands of a Heavenly God
hoping and believing through his blessed merit in the remis-
sion of my sins by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ
my Lord, and my body I commit to the earth to be buried at
the discretion of my Executors or Executor hereafter mention-
ed.

Second. I give and bequeath (my just debts being first paid) to my entirely
beloved wife Catharine Fullen Brown all my worldly means
consisting of Household furniture, stock of cattle and poultry wearing
apparel outstanding debts or whatever I am seized and possessed
