

This is the last Will and Testament of me H. McKing
written with my own hand this the eighteenth day of
June 1835, in Charleston, S. C. I give and bequeath
the whole of my household furniture both here and at
Brenton Hill / &c of every description and all my
estate / &c to my Wife Elizabeth and to my
daughter Mary Elotta King and son Prichard King,
or them and their heirs forever. It is my Will & Desire
that the whole of my estate real and personal be sold
to pay my just debts, &c &c & may be left after doing

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which, it is my will and desire that it be placed out at
Interest and employed, I mean the Interest accruing for the
Education of my daughter Mary and son Maham - that
they shall have as good an education as their minds
are susceptible of receiving and their circumstances
will admit of. I give and bequeath, saying a fourth day
before her death the just Charlotte, her future income
and their increase - I nominate and constitute my wife
Sarah to be the sole guardian of my daughter Mary and
son Maham, my friends Robert Taberham Esq. James
Campbell M.D. Executors of this my will and testament, signed, sealed
published and declared
as his last Will & Testament by the
Testator in our presence who signed
our names as Witnesses thereto
