

I give devise and bequeath to my dear friend S. Josiah Pinfield of Savannah in the State of Georgia, formerly being of Somerset and disposing must do make this my last will and testament. I desire that all my just debts be paid. I give devise and bequeath to my dear wife, Elizabeth Linneth Pinfield the Western half of Lot Number eight Frederick City, in the City of Savannah with the land, everything, Barn, Wards in the City of Savannah together with meat buildings and improvements thereon together with all my household and kitchen furniture, beds, bedding plate and books and also a riding gig at present in charge of my brother in the State of New York, to her, her heirs, executors and administrators. I also give devise and bequeath to my said wife her executors and administrators the sum of fifteen thousand dollars and I do also give devise and bequeath to my said wife her executors and administrators the following negro slaves, namely a man named Sharp and his two children Henry and Benoni and a man named Jerry.

I give devise and bequeath to my dear mother Rachel Pinfield the sum of Five thousand Dollars, to her, her executors and administrators.

I give devise and bequeath to Mrs. Sarah Pettibone the mother of my deceased wife, her heirs & administrators the sum of four thousand dollars.

I give devise and bequeath to my brother Henry S. Pinfield, his heirs, executors and administrators the whole of my undivided interest in the Estate real & personal of my deceased father, situated in the town of Ryd in the State of New York. And I also give devise & bequeath to my said brother his executors and administrators the sum of five thousand dollars.

I give devise, devise and bequeath to my executors herein after named, and to the survivor of them, his executors and administrators the sum of 1000 Dollars and Dollars in trust that they or the survivor of them, his executors or administrators will, at soon after the

to invest the same in some safe public
fund and pay the interest of
it and the principal of the same may be received to my
next brother Samuel for her sole and separate use during
her natural life and from and after her death then the
Stock shall be sold and the proceeds of such sale paid over
to my brother Henry L. Penfield to and for the use and bene-
fit of his child or children (as the case may then be) their
executors and administrators.

I give devise and bequeath to my cousin, Frederick
Mangum, son of Isaac Mangum his executors and ad-
ministrators the sum of two thousand dollars in trust
for the use and benefit of the wife and children of my said
uncle, which sum I desire may be invested and applied
at the discretion of the said Frederick Mangum.

I give, devise and bequeath to my friend, Sheldon C.
Dunning his executors and administrators the sum of two
thousand Dollars in trust for his children to be equally
divided between them.

I give, devise and bequeath to David Pendergall his
executors and administrators the sum of one hundred
dollars, and to his sister Margaret Pendergall her executors
and administrators the sum of two hundred Dollars.

I give, devise and bequeath to the Deacons of the Bap-
tist Church in Savannah and their successors the sum of
two thousand dollars in trust that the same shall be
invested in stock or public securities at their discretion
and suffered to accumulate until the necessities of the
Baptist Church Society require the traction of a new
building as a place of worship, when the aggregate a-
mount of principal and interest shall be appropriated to
that purpose.

I give devise and bequeath to the Deacons of the Baptist
Church in Savannah and their successors the sum of five
hundred dollars to be applied to the enlargement and improve-
ment of the parsonage house and fence of the Baptist
Church in Savannah.

I give, devise and bequeath to the Reverend W. B. May
of Savannah the sum of two hundred and fifty Dollars
as a token of the high respect and regard which I en-
ertain for his character as a Christian minister and friend
to be appropriated to the increase of his library.

I give, devise and bequeath to the Savannah Baptist Convention the sum of five hundred dollars in full for the purchase of a house for the use of the same.

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My will and desire further is that the said and personal estate herein before devised and bequeathed by me shall be paid into the hands of my executor after my death but in no more than seven years and be retained for the final adjustment of the affairs of my estate or as he shall see fit to pay the pecuniary legacies of it my will and desire that unless my said executor find it practicable to accomplish it without so doing that they be allowed three years for that purpose and if it is further my will and desire that my said executor shall retain from my estate during the period which may elapse between the time of my decease and the time of the payment of the pecuniary legacies for which there is indebted at and after the rate of one hundred dollars per annum until that time the said sum my mother shall receive at and after the rate of two hundred and fifty dollars per annum. Mrs Sarah Tabbott is and after the rate of two hundred and fifty dollars per annum after the time for her separate use at and after the rate of one hundred dollars per annum and the children of the late C. Manning at and after the rate of hundred dollars per annum which sums are not to be deducted from the pecuniary legacies herein before bequeathed to the parties respectively. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends Sheldon C. Manning, Joseph Manning and Anthony Butler of Savannah Executors of my last will and Testament provided that if either of them should depart this life before the final adjustment of the affairs of my estate I be in that case nominate my friend Samuel B. Parkinson to be one of my executors in the place of the deceased.
