

In the Name of God Amen. I Jean Baptiste Dubreuil aged a Forty six years
now in France and having made this City Savannah County of Christian
State of Georgia my residence for the last thirty two years, being, Subject
of said mine, money, and sundry sundry found to God for the same
do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
I give, devise and bequeath unto Paul P. Thomas and his heirs for the
profit and benefit for ever of Lemuel known generally by the name of
Lemuel Dubreuil a free Negro bornman of this City all my house hold
and kitchen furniture saving apparel, clothing, silver, Jewels and
other things to my wife and in my possession at the time of my death
I give, devise and bequeath to the said Paul P. Thomas and all the residue
of my property of what nature and kind so ever to hold and dispose of the
same in the following conditions, to wit in Trust for the said wife who of
the said Negro bornman Lemuel also Lemuel Dubreuil before her
decease for and during her natural life and after her death, I give, de-
vise and bequeath unto the name of Joseph known generally by the name
of Joseph Dubreuil a Taylor by trade and a free Negro of color of this
City One half or moiety of my said property on the proceeds thereof
after it be disposed of under the trust of my Executors hereinafter
named on his own property for ever and for the purposes aforesaid
I hereby authorize and empower my Executors, hereinafter named
to sell my Negroes, and other property, and to do what they shall
think fit and proper after my death for the benefit of my said wife and

of place and employ, the proceeds of that mine in such manner and they
 he shall find the most advantage for the interest of the said American
 during his life, even after his death for the interest of the said Joseph
 between or after his death he shall then receive the half of the
 same. And his hereby appointed executor and assigns shall
 Thomas's life of the City of Savannah afterwards, before sunrise, receiv-
 ing of the say last Will and Testament, hereby reciting and touching
 and all and every other wills or testaments, or bequests in any manner
 made by me, and do declare that the say last Will and Testa-
 ment to be fully executed after my death in the manner afore said in
 the City of Savannah. I have hereunto set my hand and seal, dated
 at Savannah this twentieth day of January in the year of our
 Lord the thousand eight hundred and thirty.
