I give devise and bequeath unto my brother William Fowler of Savannah County in the State of Georgia the whole of my estate real and personal which I now have or may hereafter possess to be his this his heirs and assigns. I do hereby constitute and appoint James M. Jones of the City of Savannah and State of Georgia my sole executor hereby revoking all other wills and declaring this to be my last. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Savannah this second day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine and of American Independence the fifty fourth
