I do hereby give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Catherine Johnson, her heirs and assigns forever all my estate real and personal of whatever nature, kind or descriptions however denoted - and for the information of my said wife I will here particularly mention four brick houses and five acres of ground in St. Johns New Brunswick which is willed to me by my Father with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. and I do hereby make constitute and appoint my dear beloved wife my sole executrix to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made and declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I do set my hand and seal this 15th day of October 1731. James^{Junr} Johnson L.S.
