

I Jacob Waring late of the City of Savannah in the State of Georgia, Merchant, being of sound mind and memory, do make constitute and publish this my last Will and Testament as follows:

First. I will and direct that all my just debts, expenses of my last sickness and funerals charges be paid and discharge do by my Executors hereinafter named.

Second. I give and devise to my Nephew Robert Thaddeus Waring to His Heirs and assigns forever all my real Estate situated in the Town of Dan in the State of Connecticut it being about one half of the Farm lately owned by my Father.

Third. I give and bequeath to my Brother Henry Waring all the remainder of my Estate of whatever name or nature and wheresoever situated to be his, His Heirs and assigns forever.

Fourth. I do hereby constitute and appoint my said brother, Henry Waring, Henry D Woods and William W Foster, Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other and former Will's by me at any time heretofore made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
