negro slaves Henry and Mary, and furthermore I do give, devise, bequeath &
relinquish to my said son Alfred C Shaw all my right title claim or
interest in & to the following negro slaves, namely, Tom, Solomon, Charles
and Moses, also being entitled to two acres in the contemplated Land Lottery
I devise and bequeath the same together with all the afore named property
real and personal unto the said Alfred C Shaw his heirs, executors, admin-
istrators and assigns forever. And I do constitute and appoint the said
Alfred C Shaw sole executor to this my last will and Testament.
