

In the name of God Amen. I
Patrick Prendergast of the City of Savannah in the
County of Chatham and State of Georgia, being of sound
and disposing mind & memory but being weak in
body, and aware of the uncertainty of all human
affairs, and being also desirous, that in the event
of my death, there should be no dispute in relation
to the disposal of my worldly estate, do make and
declare this my last Will & Testament. After
the payment of all my just debts (if any I have)
it is my will and desire, that all the estate both
real and Personal that I now have, or which I may
die possessed of, whether it consist of lands, Houses,
goods, Chattels, ready money, or other Property, which
I may possess, or be entitled to, at the time of my death,
should be divided into three equal parts, one of
said parts I give and devise, to my son Edward
his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns
forever; Another of said parts I give and devise to my
daughter Julia Ann, her heirs, executors, adminis-
trators or assigns forever; and the remaining third
I give and devise to my wife Mary, for and du-
ring the term of her natural life, provided she shall

continue unmarried; and after her death, so if she should marry then again either of said events happening it is my will and desire that the said share so be divided equally between my said wife, should she die first, and my said child, or if my said wife survive me, my said child shall be having all the share of the said estate in marriage of any said wife then to that on my (or my heirs) have over this, administrative and legal powers; and it is also my express intention that the share so bequeathed to my said wife shall be in lieu of her dower, and that she shall not be entitled to any further part of my estate than this already bequeathed; and the carrying the purposes of my said will into execution according to the manner in which I have disposed of my estate. I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Joseph Capelley & Lawrence O'Byrne executors of this my last will & testament, hereby revoking & annulling all former wills by me made.

In testimony whereof I the said Patrick Prndergast have hereunto set my hand & seal, at Savannah expressed on this fifteenth day of April in the year of our Lord and the said eighth year of said said thirty.
