two Lots of Land in the City of Savannah, known in the
Plan of said City as Lots N^o 6 (See) and N^o 7 (See) together
with all the Materials and
improvements thereon or which may be put thereon

Lot N^o 17 (See) together with all the Materials and
improvements thereon or which may be put thereon
