Chatham County Court of Ordinary September Term 1830

Present the Honorable Elias Felt, Patrick Houston and Isaac Allen Justices of the Inferior Court sitting for Ordinary purposes. Personally appeared John Wagner one of the subscribing Witnesses to the within Instrument of Writing, purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Parish Bannett late of the City of Savannah deceased who being duly sworn deposed and said that he was present and did see the said Parish Bannett deceased sign, seal, publish and declare the said Instrument purporting to be and contain his last Will and Testament that the said Bannett was at the time of testifying the same person named Mary and Mary to the best of this deponent's knowledge & belief. That he the deponent and William Campbell and Parish Tendency did witness their names thereto as witnesses.
