6th The remainder of all my property and whatever title or name it may be I bequeath to my only & unanimous heir, my sister, to have and to hold which is my last & final Will

7th And as now that this will may take effect, I name for my Executors my aforementioned Mother, and my Partner Mr. Francis Jackson & Charles who will comply & execute, this my Will as they shall see fit the time for the duty of Executorship which I am lengthened as long as it may be necessary for the said Executors to do so
