Item. I give devise and bequeath to my three beloved children
Stephen C. Green Jr. Mary Green & Susan Eliza Green all
my other Estate of every description whereever it may be found
to be equally divided among them. And lastly I do constitute &
appoint Benjamin Adams of the bridge of roads Egt. and Justice
Chapman of Providence in the County of Providence and State of
Rhode. Islands & Providence Plantations Merchant, Executor
of this my last Will and Testament.

In Testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal
this the fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand eight hundred and twenty five.
