fee simple and from the proceeds of the sale of the said
real and personal estate to pay all my just debts, and I
do hereby further direct and it is my will that after all
my just debts shall have been fully paid and satisfied
out of the proceeds of the said sale and all the residue
of my estate if any, shall be disposed of as follows.
That is to say I give and bequeath the one moiety or
half part thereof to my dear mother and in case of her
death to be divided between my brothers and sisters share
and share alike and as to the other moiety or half part
I give devise and bequeath the same to my cousins William
Habersham and Isabella Habersham sons and daughter of my
friend Robert Habersham to be equally divided between them
share and share alike and in case either of them should
die unmarried then the share of the one so dying shall
and is hereby directed to vest absolutely in the other his or
her heirs and assigns. And it is my desire and wish that
my friend Robert Habersham should wish and desire to
give, my estate either real or personal or both that he
should have a preference over all other persons. I would re-
-cept out of the property what I have above devised and
bequeathed my negro woman Celia who has been kind &
attentive to me and who I am desirous should be free
after my death. If therefore my said Executors can in any
legal mode secure to her, her freedom I desire that it shall
