 thousand eight hundred & thirty eight, make, publish and
 declare this my last will and testament, in manner
 and form following, viz:

1st I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty God

condition in life. I hereby constitute and appoint

Orleans as executor of this my last will and
testament. I give devise and bequeath unto my
dearly beloved niece Margaret Susan Cohen and my dearly
beloved nephew Thomas Nicholas Cohen children of
my said brother Thomas Cohen, all my real & personal
property as follows: viz. All that lot of ground situate
lying and being in the City of New Orleans and County of
Orleans and known and described as Lot No. (35) number
thirty five, Green Ward in said City. Also, the following named
negro slaves viz Morris, Monday and John to be divided between
them share and share alike. To have and to hold
to them the said Margaret Susan Cohen and Thomas N. C.
Cohen their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns (not as
joint tenants, but as tenants in common) and to them and to
their heirs proper use benefit and behoof forever. Lastly,
all my household furniture and all the rest, residue and
remainder of my personal estate, wherever & whatsoever
not hereinbefore given and disposed of (after payment of
my just debts and funeral expenses) I give devise and
bequeath to my said nephew and niece in manner afore-
say, giving and their heirs, executors, administrators, assigns,
&c. &c. &c. I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the day and year first above written.
