Dear Caroline

In case of accident to myself I think it proper that I should say to you that it is my intention that you shall be my sole heir and executor, and to this effect if I find it necessary I may make what is called a Will.

Meantime in order to assist you in the settlement of my affairs I would remark that my bed-room is in the hands of Thomas Wallace. Care must be taken for safe keeping and my other books in the desk of my counting room the keys of which I carry in my pocket. My papers will be found partly in my trunk and in the desk in my counting room in the case of papers in the desk in the case and a piece by the keys of which are in the desk containing my book. A tin box of papers is also kept in the desk. Books of accounts for safe keeping. All the letters I have written since some years are not copied in my letter and in consequence of my absence from it, but of such as are not copied there copies will generally be found in the pigeon holes of one of the cases above mentioned. My unsettled accounts are few but they are important. They are with the estate of the Massachusetts land representing the estate of Jonathan & Michel in the estate of Michel, and with Robt. Mitchell.

These you will find stated in the papers in my trunk with me. I would not enter now in my books because they are not finally closed. In the case of the cause of keeping open my account with the trustees I shall all to this occasionally whatever may occur. I am yours Robt. Felt
