to make or law and justice this my last will & testament
After the payment of all my just debts I give and bequeath
to my son George Gentry Junior all my property both real
and personal with the following exceptions -

To my grand daughter Sarah Wadley, the child of my daughter Abneria E. Wadley deceased - Being born baptised, the use and purchase of Fifty Shares of the Capital Stock of the Central Rail Road & Docking Company of Georgia, and also the use and service of my three negro slaves and her two children Wills and Harriet - When I shall be the same having her baptised and at her death, the said Rail Road Stock and negroes with their issue to be taken in the children of my said grand daughter, provided she have any - If she die without issue, then the said Rail Road Stock and negroes with their issue to return to the family estate and be the property of my son George's family and his heirs.

I do further will and direct that, in case the
process of the said Rail Road Trust and Rogers shall
prove to be insufficient for the support and education of
any said foundling who shall within the term of
years, the sum of of the expense of her support & education
shall be paid out of my estate provided she remain living
with any son & daughter but if she have been or get
married before she becomes of age, she shall not be
entitled only to the profits of the Rail Road Trust and
Rogers with these upon application.
