 the same to them their heirs & assigns forever absolutely and
 unconditionally forever. I give devise bequeath
 unto my wife Mary C. Snuffer and my children including any
 posthumous child, all the rest, residue & remainder of my estate,
 real & personal of which I may be seized & possessed or to
 which I may be entitled to at the time of my death, to have
 by them jointly & severally until the death of my wife, and
 from & after her decease, the whole of my estate to be divided
 among my children including any posthumous child, they
 have share & share alike to hold the same to them their heirs
 & assigns absolutely and unconditionally forever. It is further
 my will that if any of my children shall die before me
 leaving a wife or child or both, then it is my will that
 the wife & child of my said deceased child shall be entitled
 to & hold the share of my estate to which my deceased
 child would have been entitled to under this will had he
 survived me. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint
 George C. Snuffer, Richard Snuffer, and William Condict,
 Executors of this my last will and Testament. Full faith
