

I, John Robinson of the City of Savannah, Georgia, do hereby certify that this my last Will and Testament is hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me heretofore made, After the payment of all my just debt I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Robinson during her lifetime all my real and personal estate to wit, all that certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate in the City of Savannah, State of Georgia, and known as the Southern Ward part of lot number 10/100 City & Esplanade, Laid Mary Bond on the State by the whole part or parts of the said lot number 10/100, on the East by Lexington street, on the South by King and street and on the West by lot number 10/100, together with all and singular the houses outhouses, barns, lands and improvements thereon and also all my personal estate of whatever kind or description And after the death of the said Martha Robinson my beloved wife I give bequeath all the aforesaid described property and every part of parcel thereof unto my sons James C. Robinson & Charles C. Robinson and my grandson Frederick H. White to be divided equally between them share and share alike And I do hereby make, ordain and appoint Thomas Clark the executor of this my last Will and Testament.

In Witness Whereof, I John Robinson the Testator have to this Will set my hand and affixed my seal this the twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred forty

In the name of God Amen. I William M. Clark of the County
of Chatham & State of Georgia, being weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory, do hereby give unto God calling
unto mind the inevitability of my body and knowing that it is ap-
pointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this
my last Will and Testament: That is to say, principally &
first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion
of my family & executors named. And touching in
worldly estate which it has pleased God to bless me with in life,
I give and dispose of the same in the following manner
To wit: I give unto Alexander Stewart of Chatham
the sum of Five Dollars - \$5. I give unto my daughter
Mary Hunt the sum of Five Dollars - \$5. I give unto my
son Philip Clark the sum of Five Dollars - \$5. I give unto my
daughter Elizabeth Pearson the sum of Five Dollars - \$5.

And after my lawful debts are paid the balance of my
estate of whatsoever nature or kind the same may be I give
unto my beloved wife Mary M. Clark during her life & after
her death to be equally divided between her children begotten
by me lawful and share alike. And I do hereby
nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary
M. Clark executrix of this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills made by me before
this & this only to be my last Will and Testament.
