of Savannah, County of Chatham and State of Georgia, Order
of Maritime - In the name of God, Amen! I Michel
Charrier considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and
being of sound mind and memory, blessed be thought
God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will
and Testament, in manner and form following, to wit: say

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Maria Charrier,
all my personal estate, consisting of negro slaves, house &
furniture, debts due, demands, monies &c. of whatever kind,
or nature soever I may be possessed of, to her and her
 heirs and assigns forever - Also I give and bequeath unto
my said beloved wife Maria Charrier all that house
and lands situated lying and being on the South half of
lot 12, numbered as Union Ward in the said City of Savannah
and also the said lot to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly - I do hereby appoint sole executor of this my last
Will and Testament, my said beloved wife Maria
Charrier, hereby revoking all former wills I did by me make.
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
the first day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand
eight hundred and thirty five - At Charrier, S.
Signed, sealed, published and declared by the above named
Michel Charrier, to be his last Will and Testament in the
presence of us, who have hereunto subscribed our names as
Witnesses in the presence of the Estate of John B. Emory
J. Charrier. At Savannah
